Welcome to the club

Crendon Corinthians Youth Football Club (CCYFC) was formed in 1999 by parents from Long Crendon who wanted their children to play football for their village club. The club now has 13 squads across 12 age groups with over 250 boys and girls training at Long Crendon School and the Recreation Ground in the village every week.

We are an FA Charter Standard status club; the scheme that sets standards of coaching, administration and child protection for clubs working with young people; improving the playing experience for all.

In 2010 we were named Berks & Bucks FA Charter Standard Club of the Year, in recognition of our achievements across all areas of running the club.

Mission

Crendon Corinthians is committed to providing opportunities for all players to enjoy developing their skills to realise their personal and sporting potential.

Objectives

- To encourage the playing of football at all levels.
- To provide continuous development opportunities for our players, coaches and volunteers.
- To develop a culture based on respect, best practice, safety and fair play.
- To encourage parents to participate in the running of the club for the benefit of the players, club and community.

Our teams

Our teams play a number of formats of the game suited to their age and ability. Under 6 football offers the opportunity to enjoy playing the game and learning skills. Players begin playing competitively from under 7, where they play Mini-soccer.

Mini-Soccer provides children with an introduction to football so that they:

- Feel success
- Take an active part in the game
- Learn to play as a team
- Understand the laws of the game
- Develop their skills
- Can take part whatever their ability
- Develop fitness

From under 13, the teams play Youth soccer to engender a more competitive spirit. Our coaches are encouraged to embrace the competitiveness of the game with regard to team selection.

Playing for Crendon Corinthians

Getting ready to play

Parents should take responsibility for delivering and collecting their children for training and matches. They should arrive on time and should only be left unattended if they are confident that their children are happy to be left. Nippers and Under 6s must have a parent or guardian with them at all times. Whilst the club will always exercise reasonable care, and adhere to the club's Safeguarding Children Policy, parents remain ultimately responsible for the safety of their children.

It is important that players wear the right kit for training and matches in all weather conditions. This includes the football boots, shinpads and any eyewear (if appropriate). Players should always bring a bottle of water with them to drink.

Playing for Crendon Corinthians

Coaches will ensure that all players get a fair chance to play. In Mini soccer, coaches will aim to rotate substitutes so that each child gets to play the majority of each game. In Youth soccer, coaches will aim to ensure that each player gets to play at least one half per game.

How we play

The Crendon Corinthians philosophy is adopted by all players, coaches, volunteers and supporters; where winning, fair play and respect for others are considered of equal importance.

Our players:

- Show respect towards opponents, referees, team officials and supporters.
- Play as a team and work hard for each other.
- Show good sportsmanship at all times.

Our Coaches:

- Treat everyone equally
- Place the well-being and safety of players above all other considerations.
- Develop working relationships with players based on mutual trust and respect.

Our parents and spectators:

- Respect the referee, opposition players and parents
- Praise good behaviour, effort and performance
- Set an example to the children in their behaviour.
- Show consistency.

How we celebrate

The Club holds an awards day to celebrate its successes and award individuals as well as team performance. It also aims to hold a number of social events throughout the season and in particular to celebrate the end of season with a party held locally.

Subscriptions

Subscriptions are payable at the start of the season to cover the whole year. The club is not-for-profit and so subscriptions are kept as low as possible, but sufficient to cover the club's outgoings.

How we're run

CCYFC is run by a Club Committee, which is elected at its AGM. Each officer serves the term of office detailed in the table below; officers are eligible for re-election after the term of their office.

The Club Committee is responsible for:

- The administration of the Club.
- The development of the Club in line with its Ethos – Mission & Objectives.
- The periodic review and adherence to the Club's Welfare and Safeguarding Policies and Procedures, Codes of Conduct and the coordination of the Club's Volunteers and for Schools Liaison.
- Ensuring that, at all times, the Club has in place appropriate Public Liability Insurance in accordance with the guidelines issued by the Football Association from time to time.
- Ensuring continuity of Management Committee appointments
- The Club Committee hold Committee Meetings 2/3 times a year.

All managers are also part of the CCYFC Club Committee.

Apart from the term of office stated above all other roles are for a non-specified time period and would hope volunteers can commit to at least two seasons.

CCYFC holds an Annual General Meeting in July, the purpose of the AGM is to:

- receive the reports from the Officers of the Club over the previous year
- receive a written statement of the Club's finances over the previous year ended 31st May
- elect or re-elect the following officers of the Club:- Chairperson, Secretary, Treasurer
- discuss any further business

At least fourteen days before the AGM a notice of such meeting is posted on the club's website. In addition to the AGM the Committee holds at least two further meetings per year.

Club finances

A bank account is maintained in the name of CCYFC (the Club Account). Designated account signatories are agreed by the Management Committee, including the Club Treasurer. No sum is drawn from the Club Account except by cheque signed by two designated signatories. All monies payable to the Club are received by the Treasurer and deposited in the Club account.
